The PhPID is the Pharmaceutical Product Identifier, which is referring to the composition of the pharmaceutical product, including one or more active and other ingredients, quantities, and characteristics at generic levels as the pharmaceutical form and the route of administration. The reference to 'Regulated' means that this series addresses those medicines that are formally approved by a medicines agency and have a marketing authorization.

Registration is for free for all participants of the ISO/TC 215 meetings, who are registered at Hotel Lillehammer. That registration includes catering, and room rental. For participants who are not registered for the ISO/TC 215 meetings, a fee of € 100,- is requested to cover the costs which are invoiced by the hotel and the organisation of the workshop in general.
